Forward contract prices opened lower this morning. US cash markets are finishing the week lower with packers content to cut production despite strong demand for fresh pork in advance of next week's Memorial Day weekend. Lean Hog futures are also finishing the week lower and are approaching the lowest level in 2 months. June and July contracts are down 10% from the highs seen a month ago, due in large part to the counter seasonal weakness in the cash market over the last few weeks. The Canadian Dollar lost significant value against the US Dollar as currency traders flocked to the US Dollar amid another round of panic due to the European debt crisis. Please note that due to Victoria Day, we will be closed on Monday, May 24.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this morning. The soybean complex is trading higher this morning despite ongoing talk of China switching some South American soybean acquisitions to U.S. origins. These potential purchases are in addition to the USDA announcement of China buying 120,000 MT of U.S. soybeans for delivery in 2010/2011.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened lower this morning. Corn markets are trading marginally lower this morning despite decreases in crude oil futures and a stronger U.S. Dollar. Warm and dry conditions throughout the Corn Belt are expected to accelerate crop development, as well as aid growers who have yet to seed.
