Forward contract prices opened steady this morning. The U.S. cash market is trading flat to higher this morning as hog supply continues to run close to USDA estimates, and given the excellent margins, the incentive is still there for packers to increase their cash bids. Expectations of strong export sales in the coming months are the driving force behind the bullish movement of lean hog futures. South Korea is anticipated to increase their imports by 30%, as the country has already culled 24% of their herd due to Foot and Mouth Disease. Yesterday's trade saw the April contract closing up the 300 point limit, and the August contract closing at 97.45, the highest ever for August. The Canadian Dollar remains steady, trading at just over par.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened lower this morning. Improved crop prospects for South America along with slower demand from China, heading into their Lunar New Year, have the soybean complex trading lower today. As well, the market lacks any new supportive news to spark aggressive buying. However, downside movement is still expected to be limited due to limited supplies.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened higher this morning. Ongoing concerns regarding low supplies continue to support corn prices. The projected 15 year low ending stocks have traders worried that farmers will not plant enough corn in 2011 to alleviate demand. U.S. ethanol production increased again last week reaching 922,000 barrels, up from 913,000 barrels the previous week.
