Forward contract prices opened lower this morning. U.S. cash markets started this week lower, as Canadian plants were idle due to our Thanksgiving holiday. Packers maintained an aggressive daily slaughter schedule of 430,000 hogs yesterday, but available hog supplies easily met that demand. Wholesale pork prices have been firm over the last several weeks, experiencing little weakness in the higher valued cuts. However, Lean Hog futures came under pressure in trade yesterday as speculators holding long positions were spooked by the weak start to this week's cash market. The October contract expires at the end of this week, following closely with the cash market, while the December is trading at a \$3.00 discount to the current cash market. The Canadian Dollar is trading near US\$0.97 this morning, experiencing sharp gains yesterday as France and Germany made commitments to support Europe's banks.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this morning. Soybean harvest is near 35-40% complete as of Sunday. Ideal harvest weather continues in the forecast. The weekly export inspections report is expected for release today.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened higher this morning. Corn harvest is 35-40% complete as of Sunday, higher than last week's 21%. The USDA reports are expected to assist with the unknowns, as the crop progress report is due today at 4pm and tomorrow supply/demand estimates are due at 8:30am.
