## Forward contract prices opened mixed this morning.

 Packers are finishing the week with firm bids, reflecting the unprecedented demand for pork products that they are experiencing from their customers. Retail pork prices continue to make gains, and are now trading at a record high $\$ 3.56$ per pound. Exports to China over the last 3 months have been the main contributor to the higher prices, but consumers are also paying record high prices for beef and turkey as well. Lean Hog futures for 2012 represent good value, but do not reflect the normal price relationship with the current cash market as traders are cautious of factoring in a continuation of the recent Chinese buying spree.
