Forward contract prices opened mixed this morning. U.S. cash markets started this week lower with pork prices still under pressure, largely from weaker ham prices. The pork carcass cut-out typically comes under pressure in the fall from abundant supplies, however pork price have been relatively stable over the last two months, while last year saw the cut-out drop by \$15/cwt over the same timeframe. Lean Hog futures are down to their lowest level in a month, with traders unwilling to factor in a premium for the 2012 contracts due to the recent weak cash market trend. The Canadian Dollar is trading more than 2 cents lower this morning as news that Greece was going to put the question of the bailout package to a referendum caused turmoil in the markets.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened mixed this morning. Surprise referendum on Greece's debt issues has renewed fears of default. The already strained soybean demand faces a stronger U.S. dollar as investors go back to the global currency. Soybean harvest is 87% complete as of Sunday.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened lower this morning. USDA is set to release the crop production report tomorrow morning. Corn harvest is 78% complete, up from last week by 13%! Corn harvest in the eastern part of the corn belt is lagging.
