Forward contract prices opened mixed this morning. U.S. cash markets are trading higher this again this morning, as packers play catch up on their fresh pork supplies after last week's reduced slaughter week. Product markets are firm because the picnics surged by 10%, reflecting strong demand for the lower valued cuts. Some analysts have the cash market gaining over \$3.00/cwt in the next 4 weeks leading up to Christmas, which would easily meet what has been factored in by the futures. Futures came under pressure yesterday, the opposite direction as a broad stock and commodity market move. The Canadian Dollar surged by more than a cent and a half in trade yesterday as there were rumours а bailout for the Italian government buoyed markets.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened lower this morning. Taiwan is planning to purchase 12,000 tonnes of soybeans. The Weekly Export Inspections report showed 41.4 million bushels were exported, which is on par with expectations. The bio -diesel tax credit is set to expire at the end of this year, inciting worries that US production would decrease.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened higher this morn-Taiwan is planning to purchase 23,000 tonnes of corn. The

Weekly Export Inspections report came in at the high end of expectations, 30.6 million bushels. A firm profit margin for ethanol producers appears to be keeping domestic demand robust.
