Forward contract prices opened higher this morning. U.S. cash markets weakened in most regions yesterday, as some packers cut production in an attempt to bring cash bids in line with wholesale pork prices. The pork cut-out traded \$1.24/cwt higher, resulting in a marked improvement to estimated packer margins. However, pork production is only likely to decline over the next 6 months, in line with typical seasonal trends. Lean hog futures moved higher in trade yesterday, but are still representing values well short of normal cash market trends, when using the current cash market as the benchmark. Most of undervaluation can be attributed to the relatively weak cut-out value. The Canadian dollar is trading better than par value with the U.S. Dollar this morning, as traders have chosen to focus on higher commodity prices and indications that the Chinese economy remains strong.

ing. Argentina's corn forecast was lowered to 26 million tonnes by the USDA. Corn prices are seeing support by tight supplies due to weather, this should increase demand for U.S. corn supplies.
