Forward contract prices opened mixed this morning. U.S. cash markets are heading lower this week, as pressure from poor operating margins are forcing some packers to cut back on their slaughter significantly. Alternatively, the pork cut-out has seen some support in recent days, which contributes positively to the still unprofitable margins. Currently, gross margins excluding the offal value are running near \$2.50/hog, not enough to cover fixed and variable costs. Lean Hog futures surged higher in trade yesterday, taking some of the summer month contracts to within \$1.00/cwt of contract highs. However, traders remain cautious in pricing in too large a premium, as reflected in the April contract that is trading only modestly higher than the current cash market. The Canadian Dollar is trading higher this morning, seeing support from higher commodity prices.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this morning. Brazil's soybean crop yields are getting tighter, as hot dry weather is prevailing. Lower supply supports higher prices, as demand doesn't appear to be slowing down. USDA indicated China is looking for 116,000 metric tons of U.S. soybeans.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened higher this morn-

ing. The U.S. dollar is weaker this morning, making U.S. corn relatively less expensive for others to import. Feedmakers in South Korea sought 350,000 tonnes of corn this week. Corn planting for the 2012/13 season is looking to be the largest since WWII.
