Forward contract prices opened lower this morning. U.S. cash markets started this week mostly higher, but were not matched by increases in the pork cut-out. Monday's slaughter was estimated at 375,000 hogs, about 10% smaller than last week's, due to some processors taking Packers are contending with a tightening hours for U.S. President's Day. supply of hogs, but do not have room in their margins to chase them. The pork cut-out is trading at \$86.46/cwt, approximately 4% lower than year ago levels, the first time in months where the current price is less than year ago levels. Lean Hog futures do not consider this a significant factor, as traders are still pricing summer month contracts at or near the cash prices experienced in 2011. The Canadian Dollar is trading steady at a level slightly higher than parity with the U.S. Dollar, with no significant news arising over our extended weekend.

**ing.** Ukraine feed wheat has been competing with the U.S. corn market this vear, which is viewed as positive for livestock feeders as corn ending stocks are tight. South Korea purchased 132,000 tonnes of U.S. corn.
