## Thursday, February 23, 2012

Forward contract prices opened lower this morning. U.S. packers have bid their operating margins back into the red, with cash bids trading about \$1.50/cwt higher than the current pork cut-out. Hog supplies over the last month have come in higher than most had anticipated, possibly due to the moderate temperatures across North America improving growing conditions. Yesterday, the USDA released the most recent Cold Storage Report which showed an increase in the supply of pork. Total pork in storage was 8% higher than the same period last year, with increases in most categories. Growing supplies can be an indication of a slowdown in pork export sales, which is a primary factor driving Lean Hog futures. The Canadian Dollar is trading slightly higher, but is still within the trading range it has established over the last several weeks.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened mixed this *morning.* The rain forecasted for Brazil's southern region seems to have vaporized, now calling for dry weather. In central and northern Brazil wet weather has slowed soybean harvesting.

## Canadian delivered corn prices opened higher this morn-

ing. The USDA Outlook Forum supply/demand conference will meet today and tomorrow to assess the new crop season. The USDA increased the corn of planted acreage estimate to 94.5 million acres. Trendline yield estimates are 164 bushels per acre. Dry soil in the western Corn Belt and northern plains would affect yield outlook.
