Forward contract prices opened lower this morning. U.S. cash bids, the pork cut-out and Lean Hog futures all started the week lower yesterday, reflecting a lack of optimism for a short term recovery. U.S. packer's margins are still under pressure, with operating margins too low to cover their fixed and variable costs. At times, export sales (which are not captured in the pork cut-out value) are strong enough to motivate packers to increase bids despite stagnant pork prices. However, evidence suggests that export sales are down from recent months, with the latest Cold Storage report showing supplies up 8% over year ago levels. Lean Hog futures are starting the day lower again this morning, with traders pessimistic about export sales potential. The Canadian Dollar is trading above parity with the U.S. Dollar this morning, largely due to stronger oil, and metal markets.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this

morning. The foundation for the soybean rally appears to stem from the tightened U.S and world supply outlook for the new crop season. A drop of near 4% for the world production of soybeans by the International Grains Council last week is a large decrease. Weak crush margins in China may slow their purchasing pace, at least in the short term, offsetting some demand pressure.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened lower this morn-

ing. This spring it is anticipated that farmers will add about 2 million corn acres. The USDA estimates the yields will essentially double ending stocks. If this comes to fruition corn prices should get pushed down below the \$5 mark by the fourth quarter and early 2013.
