Forward contract prices opened higher this morning. U.S. cash markets were stable in trade yesterday, with slight reductions in the hog supply matching up with weaker packer demand. Packers continue to struggle with their operating margins as the pork cut-out is priced only marginally higher than packer bids. Exacerbating this, are concerns over export demand which can offset a significant portion of the poorer domestic pork prices. Export data for beef, which is much more current, shows a weaker trend to South Korea, Mexico and Hong Kong compared to year ago levels. Summer month Lean Hog futures are down about \$2.00/ cwt from their recent highs, but are finding some support this morning. The Canadian Dollar is up sharply this morning, reacting to news of good economic growth in the U.S. and the perception of greater stability in Europe.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this

morning. A smaller Brazilian soybean crop should push additional export demand to the U.S. for near term needs. China's improving crush margins, as noted by the National Grain and Oils Information Centre, could elevate their soy demands.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened higher this morn-

ing. China's strong demand for the old corn crop, which is tight in supply, had corn seeing a rally in prices yesterday. The possibility of a huge 2012 crop does nothing to offset current demand in this crop year amid tight supplies. South America currently lacks an exportable surplus, which could have U.S. exports increase and tighten old crop ending stocks by 50-75 million bushels, creating a bullish outlook for old crop contracts.
