Forward contract prices opened higher this morning. u.s. packers struggling with very poor operating margins have prevented any significant rally in the

cash market, as there is little incentive for packers to maintain production levels. The export business has slowed down significantly from two months ago, a factor that kept hog prices stronger than is typically seen through the early winter months. Lean Hog futures found support late in yesterday's trading session, but are not seeing a continuation into this morning. Summer month contracts represent good value, especially in the context of the uncertain export markets, which may have trouble meeting the same volumes as was seen last year. The Canadian Dollar continues to appreciate amid improving global economic indicators, resulting in a negative impact on forward prices.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this

morning. Improved rains in Argentina since mid-January have only slightly increased soy crop yield recovery in the region. There is insufficient fresh news to influence the bullish momentum of soy, however, weekly export sales are on par with expectations. Soy futures should stabilize assuming the markets have factored in all of the Soy-complex's available information.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened higher this morn-

ing. U.S. ethanol production is on pace to exceed the USDA's yearly estimate, however, given notably poor plant operating margins near term ethanol production looks to slide. Corn used in last week's ethanol production was 95.44 million bushels producing a total of 6.272 million barrels of ethanol. To meet the USDA's estimate, corn needs to average 94.3 million bushels/week, thus illustrating an overage of 1.14 million bushels/week currently being used.
