Forward contract prices opened higher this morning. U.S. cash markets were sharply higher in trade vesterday, surprising market participants by the magnitude of the move. Some question as to how sustainable the gains are as estimated packer operating margins have been pushed deep into the red at \$13.00/hog. Nevertheless, it is a positive factor to see packers so competitive for the diminishing supply. Lean Hog futures are showing cautious gains with the exception of the June contract which is set to expire next week. After the recent rally, traders are hesitant to get too bullish on the market as there are still concerns of weaker domestic demand and the large inventory in cold storage. The Canadian Dollar increased only modestly in trade yesterday after the Bank of Canada held their benchmark interest rate steady at 1.00%.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this **morning.** The soybean market is seeing support from outside forces along with firm demand for meal. Offsetting this is forecasted rain for the next 6-10 day period across the Midwest. Concern that the Corn Belt crops may experience some stress due to dryness will continue unless significant rain comes to fruition.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened higher this morning. Corn may see support from the updated weather outlook for the next week and a half. Forecasted rain looks to be sufficient enough to maintain crop development. The longer term weather outlook looks more bullish, hot and dry for the heart of the Corn Belt.
