Forward contract prices opened lower this morning. US cash markets reported a modest recovery in trade vesterday, but packers still have little incentive to aggressively seek supplies with current operating margins still negative by about \$2.00/hog. The pork cut-out did experience some support after the ham primal gained about 8% in value yesterday. However, the rest of the primal cuts that make up the voluntary pork carcass value were weaker. Export markets appear to be providing little support to the cash market. causing futures to come under pressure. The June contract is trading near its lowest level since last July when traders believed that the drought induced higher feed costs would trigger a liquidation in the breeding herd. The latest pork production estimates for the US are up about 1% over year ago levels, contributing to the recent weakness in the futures. Alternatively, the Canadian Dollar has been weaker recently, impacted by a weaker economic outlook.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened lower this morning. US soybean futures opened lower this morning. South American weather continues to weigh heavily on the market amid improved precipitation forecasts that are adding pressure to futures prices. As well, some traders in the US have expressed concern that the Chinese traders will fully shift their attention to SA next week as they return from this week's Lunar New Year holiday.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened lower this morning. US corn futures are trading lower this morning. As with soybeans, SA weather continues its influence on trading and the expected rainfall is prompting the bearish tone. Domestic ethanol demand remains weak and analysts also note that the premium price of US corn is limiting its export demand relative to the Ukraine and Brazil product. US markets are expected to react only modestly following last night's State of the Union Address in the United States.
