Forward contract prices opened mixed this morning. US cash markets started the week with lower bids as hog supplies continue to recover; however, the numbers remain at a 5% deficit compared to last year. Carcass weights of 212 lbs. have narrowed the gap in pork production given that last year's weights were lighter by about 5 lbs. (or 2.5%) compared to recent weights. Packers continue to benefit from good profitability with the prices of hams, bellies and pork trimmings making positive contributions last week. The USDA recently revised its projections for pork production in 2015, bumping up estimates by 2.6% over last month's projections. This may indicate that the USDA does not anticipate a spike in PEDv cases, despite the disease being far more widespread. Two new vaccines have been developed over the past year in an effort to control the disease, but their efficacy is still unproven. Lean Hog futures started this week's trade with most of the 2015 contracts making gains in spite of the changes to USDA projections.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this morn-

ing. US soybean futures are trading higher. Support comes in part from a slow harvest: today's Crop Progress report is expected to come in between 35% and 40% complete compared to the 53% 5-year average. As well there are rumors that the 'bottom' is very near, if it hasn't materialized already and although a massive crop is expected, there is talk that Chinese demand could take up a good portion of the US exports.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened even this morning. US corn futures are trading lower after seeing some early morning support. The USDA was closed on Monday for Columbus Day; the Crop Progress report, released today, is expected to show 25-35% complete compared to the 43% 5-year average. Although the harvest is behind, pressure remains on thoughts of a very large crop supported by above trend line yield expectations, and still no news of the Chinese relaxing the ban on varieties of US corn and DDGs.
