Forward contract prices opened lower this morning. US cash markets started this week lower from last week's trade with packers still largely focused on protecting profitable operating margins. All regions reported prices under US\$90/cwt, the lowest level experienced since February, when the first PEDv induced shortage was seen. Wholesale pork prices were higher yesterday as the cut-out gained approximately \$2.00/cwt recovering to the benchmark \$100/ cwt. Ham values were the largest contributor to the gains, but with less than a month before US Thanksgiving, support is unlikely beyond another 2 weeks. The USDA released the latest Cold Storage report yesterday, which showed total pork inventory down 4% from year ago levels. Supplies of pork bellies are 43% higher than year ago levels, which helps to explain their relatively low price and contribution to the pork cut-out. Lean Hog futures are still decisively in a lower trend, but cash market support could lead to a bounce in the nearby contracts due to their discount from the cash market. Deferred month contracts are expected to continue their choppy trend, with traders watching for a cool weather spike in PEDv.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this morn-

ing. Domestically, some quality issues mean interior crushers need relatively more beans to produce oil and the situation is exacerbated by bottlenecks in the rail system; truck bids have jumped \$20 per ton on top of the rally. Internationally, Malaysia has raised the blend of palm oil in biodiesel from 5 to 7%, taking oil out of the market as processors using palm switch to soy. US farmers brought in 17% of the crop last week; harvest came in at 70%, in line with market expectations but below the 79% average.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened even this morning.US

corn futures are trading higher on strength from the soybean complex and on news that the funds have resumed a buying spree in agricultural commodities generally. But despite the recent strength, analysts note the fundamentals are generally bearish. Weekly harvest came in at 46%, slightly above expectations but new crop is only 'trickling' in. Exports remain weak, are below the 5-year average, and there is no end in sight to the Chinese ban on certain varieties.
