US cash markets are called to trade steady today, with some packers cutting hours ahead of tomorrow's statutory holiday. After hitting the lowest cash price of 2014 on Monday, most packers were bidding the market higher to secure supplies for their Friday and Saturday slaughter. The focus of most industry participants was on the results of the Hogs and Pigs report released yesterday afternoon. The report was fairly close to what the industry had anticipated, but the differences across almost every category had the report showing a larger inventory than the average estimate. in Fall 2015 hog slaughter being 7% larger than 2014 or 3% larger than 2013. While the market probably anticipated some of these results, projected supply increases of this magnitude could result in further pressure to the deferred month contracts. Producers should view current prices as 'fair value' and consider hedging up to 20% of their 2015 production to eliminate some of the uncertainty in market prices.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this morn-

ing. US soybean futures are trading lower heading into the reduced-hour holiday sessions following a choppy trade yesterday. There is some talk of profit taking ahead of the holiday. Expectations that Chinese demand could rise by ~7% and lowering palm oil production is supportive. Good (and improving) S. American weather and a high USD is pressuring. The US markets are closed one hour early today and closed all day December 25.

Canadian delivered corn prices opened even this morning. US corn futures are trading lower heading into the holiday despite a recent bout of supportive news. Chinese officials have lifted the US ban, there are expectations of increased feed usage, and decent domestic demand has been supportive. Pressure comes from Chinese approval of an Argentine GMO variety, and competition in world markets; Ukraine has exceeded last year's exports. h@ms Marketing will be closed December 25, 26 and will resume normal business hours on Monday, December 29.
