Forward contract prices opened lower this morning. US cash markets are holding steady amid ample supplies for packers. Hog supplies are expected to grow from the current trend of 4% more than year ago levels to 6.7% more for the summer months as several US producers ramp up production in preparation for two new packing plants coming on stream. This expectation of significantly larger pork production in the US is the primary reason for the summer month lean hog futures being unable to sustain gains. The June and July contracts are trading at only a \$5.00 USD/cwt premium to the current cash index, whereas they typically hold a premium of approximately \$14/cwt at this time of year. The fall months are trading at a slightly smaller than average discount to the summer month contracts, which represents a good pricing opportunity given the outlook for record setting pork production. Producers should look to cover 20-30% of their production in the Sep -Dec timeframe to secure profitable production in this uncertain period.

Canadian delivered soymeal prices opened higher this morn-

ing. Supply side dynamics continue to pressure the US soybean complex. Official Brazil production estimates have been raised 3.6 MMT above USDA numbers to 107.6 MMT. While this number is not the 109 MMT frequently talked about, it still represents a record number and supports ideas that a lot of beans will be coming from the region this year. It will be interesting to see what, if any, adjustments are made to South American production in today's WASDE report, which, could reveal surprises. Regardless, production from South America ranges between 54.0 and 56.0 MMT for Argentina and 107.0-109.0 MMT for Brazil

US corn futures opened lower this morning. Like beans, US corn futures are facing some pressure as big crops in South America get bigger. Officials in Brazil have raised corn production 3.3 MMT higher than the current USDA estimate which may or may not be adjusted in today's WASDE report. Most market participants do expect some adjustment to be made (likely higher) and pre-report estimates are coming in between 86.0 and 91.5 MMT. Conversely, Argentine production is expected to range between 35.0 and 37.0 MMT. In any event, a lot of corn (and a lot of potential competition for US corn) is on the way to the global market.
