US cash markets are mixed mid-week with the ISM and WCB regions down about \$0.20 USD/cwt while the National region is up by \$0.30 USD. A return to 'normal' slaughter levels was achieved yesterday following weather related disruptions earlier this week and last week as well. The reduced slaughter capacity absolutely impacts the year over year comparisons, but the reductions are not trend setting and a large amount of pork is still expected to be processed which is weighing on the market. Lower cut-out values are squeezing margins, but packers are still profitable and motivated to keep hooks full. Hams led the primals lower for a net negative 34-cent change on the day and are maintaining the low values that have been seen since the beginning of the year. the session but a drop in the value of the Canadian dollar has meant Canadian forward contract levels have been maintained slightly higher than yesterday's close. The current futures values reflect a story of 'two markets. Summer contracts are at lows relative to history on massive supply and no real news on the export trading front while fourth quarter futures months are at post-2014 closing value highs on continued optimism that trade conflicts will be resolved. The degree to which an ASF premium is priced remains to be seen (i.e. some is likely but

Hope continues to buoy the market with China 'potentially' responding positively to President Trumps request to remove tariffs on agriculture products being cited in some widely-read publications (!). Today, however, the market has pulled back from recent strength as the numbers don't yet match the rhetoric. Tomorrow should be a telling day as up to date weekly export numbers will be released before the market opens. Ongoing volatility is expected to be a common theme until the Trump/Xi meeting later this month.

US corn futures opened lower this morning. Like beans, US corn futures are in a two-sided and choppy pattern as the market awaits news on direction. Tomorrow's export report should provide some clues, but the market appears to be waiting for that 'big news' event which has revolved around the China/USA trade situation of late. However, an article surfaced that Mexico may attempt to place more tariffs on the US (including corn) as the steel and aluminum issue tariff lingers. Recall that Mexico is the number one importer of US corn.
